Our South Carolina Division Confederate Memorial Day 2025

On May 3, 2025, the South Carolina Divisions of Sons of Confederate Veterans, United Daughters of the Confederacy, and the Children of the Confederacy held a join Confederate Memorial Day Service and Women of the South Monument Dedication at Secession Hill in Abbeville, SC.

This day certainly was the best Confederate Memorial Day service in my recent memory for a couple of reasons.

It was the first time that the South Carolina Division SCV has ever held a Confederate Memorial Day service on a piece of property that we OWN! Thanks to the generous donation of Mr. Robert Hayes of Olde Abbeville Camp 39, the South Carolina SCV now owns and manages the beautiful piece of property including four Confederate Monuments that have been erected on the site over the years.



The attendance and response from our South Carolina Confederate community was outstanding with well over 300 people in attendance. The weather cooperated with overcast skies most of the morning which worked in our favor to keep it from getting too hot and a cool breeze was enjoyed by most on this warm

spring morning. The rain held off all morning until after the service was completed.

UDC SC Division Vice-President Jan Stewart led the service and welcomed all guests, and SCV Division Chaplain Danny Blackwell gave the invocation. The 16th SC Honor Guard led by Color Sergeant Rossie Meadow posted the colors and pledges were given to the SC Flag, the Confederate Battle Flag and the Christian Flag. SC SCV Chief of Staff Dean Stevens read the Charge to the Daughters and Sons of Confederate Veterans as given to us by Lt. Gen. Stephen D. Lee on April 25, 1906.

Greetings were given by UDC President General Julie Hardaway, ANV Commander Jamie Graham, UDC Recorder General of Military Service Awards Tammy Herron, CofC SC Division President Charlotte Chumley, SCV SC Division Commander Perry Smith, SC Division MOS&B Commander Jim Hopkins, and SC Palmetto Battalion Commander Colonel Leland Summers.

SC Division Guardian Committee Chairman Archie Herring called forth and pinned Guardian Pins on five new SC Guardians of Confederate Soldiers graves in a ceremony in front of the new Women of the South Monument.

The keynote speaker, author and historian Keith Jones was introduced by Vice-President Stewart. Mr. Jones gave a very poignant address about the character of the Confederate Soldier and how our boys had the opportunity to act badly in times of war but they without fail acted like true Southern gentlemen with kindness and grace and compassion even for the enemy in very difficult circumstances of war unlike the behavior of our Northern foe.

After the address, wreaths and flowers were placed on the grave of the Unknown Confederate Soldiers by members of the UDC and Children of the Confederacy. A musical interlude and songs were provided by Mr. and Mrs. Barrow Wheary.

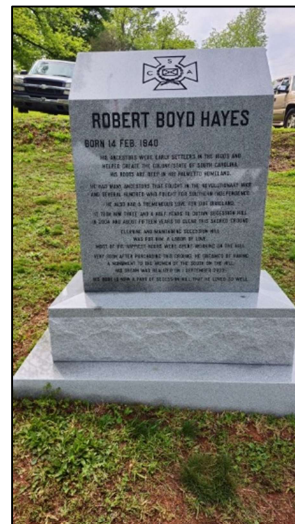

The addition of Deputy Adjutant Tucker will hopefully take some of the load off of Adjutant Moore as well as provide the Division with a backup plan in case Adjutant Moore retires or just gets fed up with the Division Commander! Please thank our new Deputy Adjutant as well as Adjutant Moore when you see them.

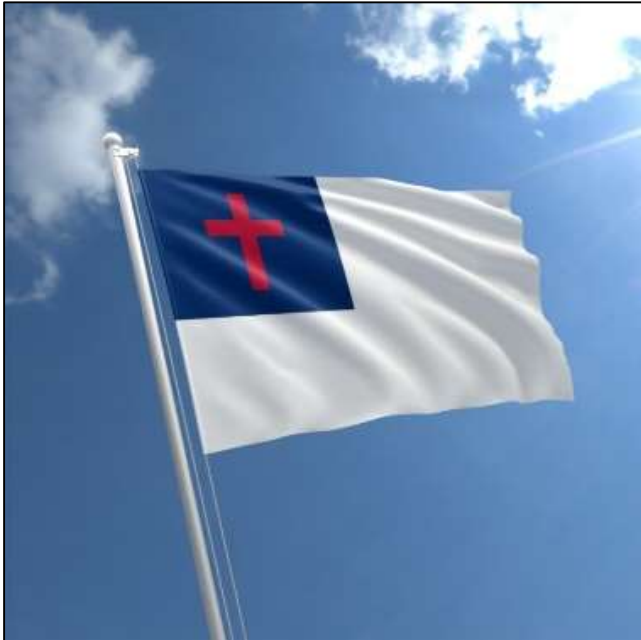

Because I live nearby our SC Division Commander Perry Smith, I am often asked to accompany him as he visits many different SCV camps around our great Division to give presentations.

One common theme I hear is "We are all getting OLDER so we need to bring in new members to carry on our important work given to us in our Charge to defend the good name of our Confederate Ancestors! But HOW do we do this? We can't afford to sit back and wait for new members to come to us.

SCV SC Division Legislation Committee Report on June 25, 2025

Concerning Monument Protection Bill
H.4260 in Judiciary Committee
and S.508 in Finance Committee

We would like to thank all the Compatriots, Camp Commanders, Brigade Commanders, and the Division Staff who stood up for our ancestors and participated in contacting State Senators and Representatives about supporting the Monument Protection Bill.

The bill did not make it to the floor in this past session. Rep. Bill Taylor told us that unfortunately too many other critical bills had to be passed first. They didn't want to try to rush it through the last week of the waning moments of the session and have some amendment sneak into the bill in a last rush to pass it.

In many ways, however, this was the most successful session we have had since the initial Heritage Bill was passed.

We have been assured that in the next session; the Bill will be one of the first things brought up in the Senate where it is expected to easily pass. Once the Senate passes it, the House will follow.

In this past session:

- For the first time in recent memory, the Speaker of the House asked us to meet with him.
- The Chairman of the House Judiciary Committee, W. Newton, co-sponsored the bill.
- This is the first time that 29 Senators Co-Sponsored the Bill.
- This is the first time that 29 Representatives Co-Sponsored the Bill.
- The President of the SC Senate Co-Sponsored the Bill. (Thomas Alexander)
- The Majority Leader of the SC Senate Co-Sponsored the Bill (Shane Massey)
- 24 is the Majority needed to pass a bill in the Senate. We already have 29 co-sponsors. So it just needs to get to the floor in next session and we have the vote!

Continue to reach out to American Legion, UDC, DAR, SAR, and other veteran groups and obtain their contact information so you can quickly reach out to them in the Fall to ask them to support this bill by having their members call their state legislators.

Think out over the summer how you plan to have your camp conduct a letter and phone campaign in Dec-Jan to encourage your legislators to become co-sponsors once the next session starts.

There is the possibility that Camps may have legislators in their area that have not been contacted because that Camp may have members who are not located in that specific legislator's district. Commanders need to make sure that camp members contact all legislators in their area. You do not have to be in their district to encourage them to protect SC Veteran's Monuments!

We are very close to getting this over the goal line! Let's plan a maximum effort this fall.

Once again, we thank all the members who participated in this campaign. Let's make Dec-Jan our biggest push ever so we can get this bill over the goal line!

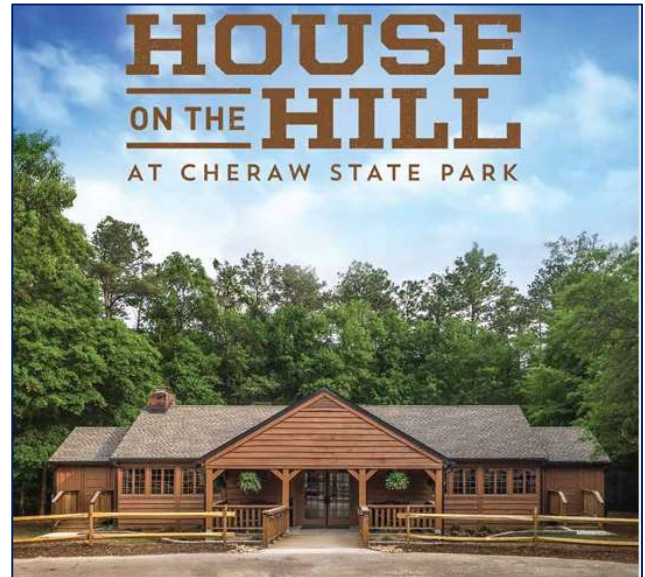

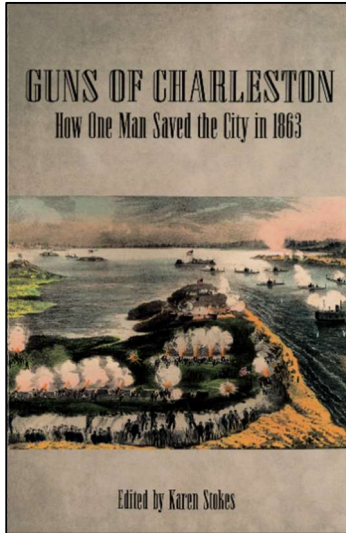

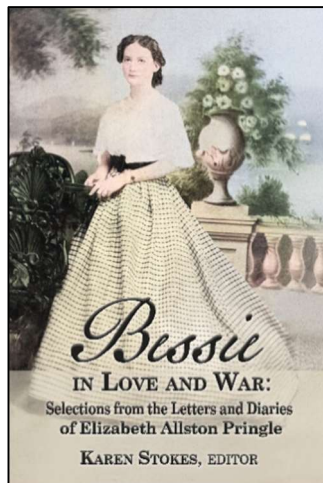
